THE PLATINUM JUBILEE 2022

This unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 invites people from across the United Kingdom to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee" and has been hugely successful.

With support from Shropshire and Telford & Wrekin Councils, Shropshire residents, businesses and organisations have embraced this initiative and many thousands of trees have been planted across the County from late last year until March 2022. The planting season has now come to an end and will commence again in October. Where trees have been planted individuals and organisations have been encouraged to place a "pin" on a virtual map, which will form the basis of a presentation to Her Majesty. Many communities across Shropshire have been busy planting trees to put their community on the map.











QUEEN'S AWARDS

Spring marks the start of the prestigious Queen's Awards activity. Indeed, hot off the press, and announced this week, we are delighted to offer our congratulations to all four of the Shropshire 2022 Queen's Award for Enterprise winners. Telford based i2R winning for the second time, new winners Derwen College in Oswestry, Jesmonite in Bishops Castle and Stallion AI from Whitchurch. Shropshire is full of exciting and innovative businesses and The Queen's Award for Enterprise is a wonderful way of celebrating these successes, it is the highest official UK award for British business. These four winners are spread throughout the county and are success stories with diverse contributions to enterprise and a wonderful advertisement for what is going on in a predominantly rural county that prides itself on having idyllic countryside alongside a fast-growing business culture.

The Queens Award for Enterprise seeks not just to celebrate but to inspire achievement; businesses can see their work in areas of international development, innovation, social mobility, and sustainable development recognised. Each year the Lieutenancy staff run promotional events to explain the process and encourage companies to apply.

Last year we were fortunate to be offered wonderful support by three Shropshire based organisations; Reech Media, BeBold PR and Aico which enabled the Lieutenancy to reach more of our fantastic innovative businesses and resulted in many more applications for an award. In addition, the Lieutenancy was able to offer potential entrants support in checking their entries and helping businesses to understand what the QAE judges are looking for in applications.

Each year the Shropshire launch of the Queen's Award for Enterprise is supported by the Business Representative Organisations such as the Chamber of Commerce and The Federation of Small Businesses alongside the Marches Local Enterprise Partnership.

We will be launching the 2023 QAE competition on May 20th with events in both Shrewsbury and Telford where we hope to attract businesses keen to find out more about the QAE process, hear tips from previous winners and network with likeminded, innovative, and ambitious Shropshire businesses. We are working with Reech Media again to have an updated QAE Shropshire microsite to offer a virtual showcase of the awards in Shropshire and BeBold PR will again be providing the social media support. We hope to encourage more applications for this world recognised award over the next few months.
